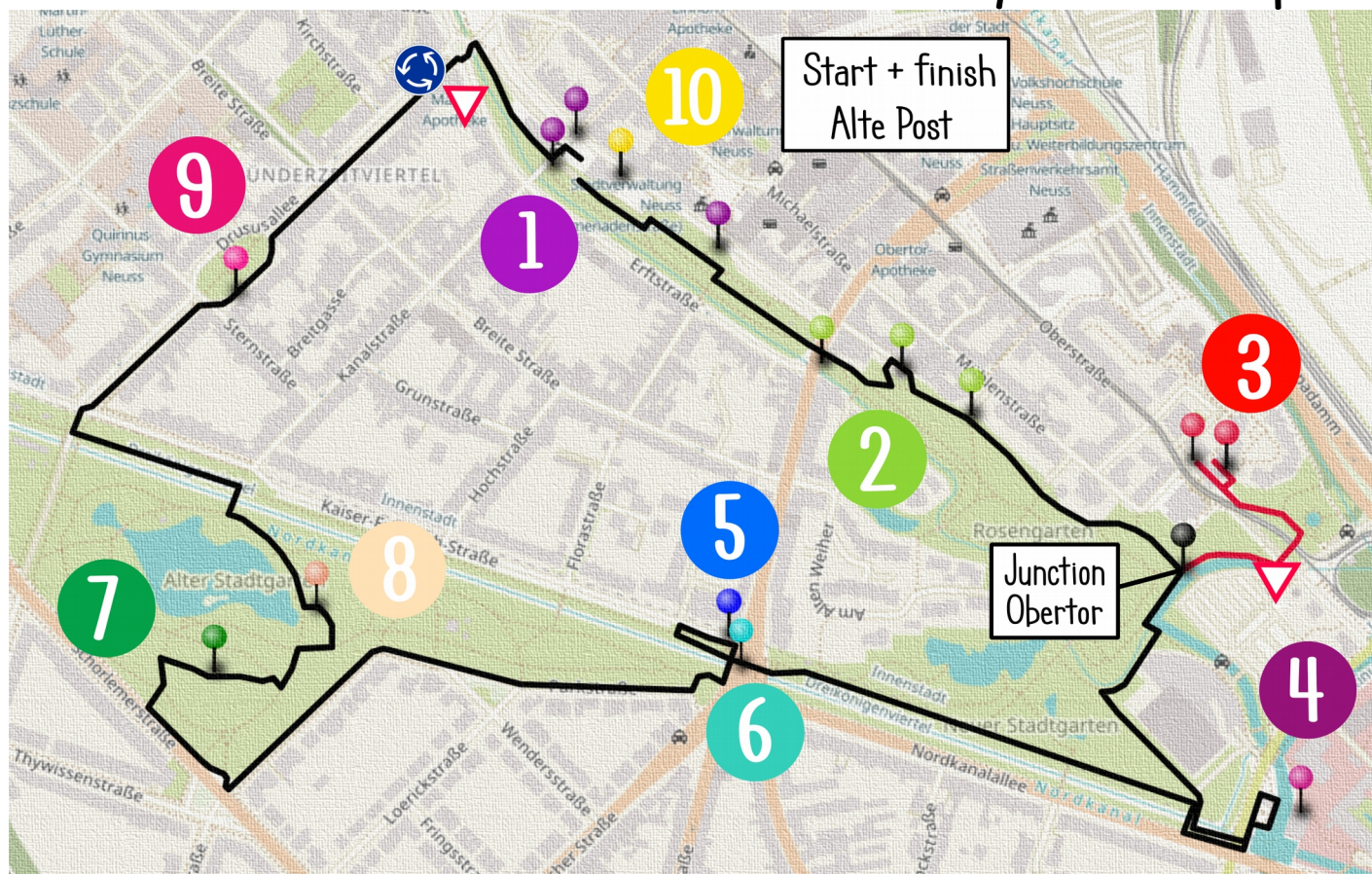

**L** Biologist Theodor Schwann was born 1810 in Neuss. He discovered the cell structure of all beings and also the principles of cell metabolism. Cells can turn nutrition into energy, e.g. body heat and muscle strength.

**A** This monument by Ulrich Rückriem is reminiscent of the synagogue. The religious centre of the Jewish community of Neuss stood opposite here until 1938. Look at all those names! When your grandparents were young children, millions of Jewish citizens were deported and murdered. We altogether are determined to never let happen sth so sad and devastating again.

**M** The sewer worker made of bronze reminds us to all the hardworking people in Neuss for the sake of the city's facilities: Water, electricity, light, garbage management, canals, buses, parks und greens ...

The last existing semicircle-tower of the fortress wall. The origin of its name ist unknown. In the 13th century 23 semicircular towers stood around Neuss to impress invaders by pretending big round towers full of soldiers. Nowadays families use it for celebrations in the style of the middle ages.

W i N D \_ Ü H L E N T U R \_

Matthias Weber, called the Fetzer, was imprisoned in the tower top, because he had stolen the Neuss coucil silver. He was able to flee over the mill wings without injuring himself: He landed gently on a large pile of dung!

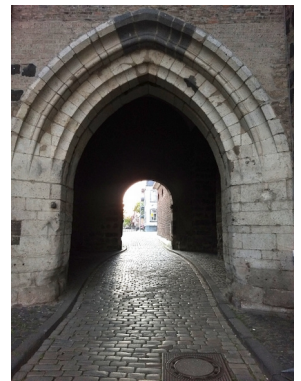

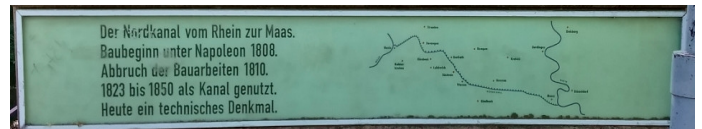

This beautiful avenue was named after

Built around 1900 for strolling in the Wilhelminian era, now a parking lot.



**Benno-Nussbaum-Square – Passing the Roundabout by bicycle?**



**Enter the roundabout:** Give way to inside traveling vehicles 

Inside the roundabout you have the right of way – watch out though  
Safety distance to curb – cars should stay behind you, not overtake you



**Zebra crossing preferred?** Get off, push on foot: only then right of way  
Then turn right into Wierstraetweg to Neustraße
